4th Sunday of Advent A

Tin the First reading the prophet Isaiah talked about the coming of a very special child; but there is no reason to believe that he knew just how special that child could be. Christians believe that Isaiah's prophecy only found its complete fulfilment in Jesus.

The Second Reading and the Gospel reveal to us the double identity of this special child. No prophecy is fully understood until after its fulfilment.

Both St Paul and Mathew make it clear that Jesus was the Son of David. This was so because Joseph, his legal father, was descended from the line of David. David is one of the greatest figures in the Old Testament. He succeeded Saul as King of Israel. It was he who united the scattered tribes and formed them into a nation. Even though he sinned, he repented. Jesus referred to as 'Son of David'. To say that Jesus came from the line of David was already a great thing. He has another, and infinitely greater identity. He is 'Emmanuel', which means 'God is with us.' He is the Son of God. Hence, he is able to save his people from their sins.

We believe then in the double identity of Jesus. He is Son of David and Son of God. But we too have a double identity. As children of our parents, we are human beings, which means we have a human identity. But through Jesus we have become children of God, which means we also have a divine dignity. However, our divine dignity, like that of Jesus, is a matter of faith.

Celebrate your Sacrament of Confession before Christmas, Thursday from 10.30am to 12noon.

Confession is good for the souls. The unspoken evil a person has done is a worm eating his heart away. We have a need to talk about what is worrying us. We also may need guidance. Confession involves a painful scrutiny of self. We have to come to terms with the dark side of ourselves. But we must remember that Christ did not come to judge us, but to save us. We are invited to judge ourselves, to look at ourselves, to examine ourselves. It is not easy to admit our poverty, our weakness, our sins. But we must make a clean sweep if we are to find cleanness, wholeness and peace coming from the Emmanuel, God with us.

Penitents who receive absolution at the general confession are obliged to make an individual confession if they are aware that they have committed serious sin. This is the condition on which General Absolution can be offered in extraordinary situations.
