# 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday Advent A.

The prophets had a vision of a new world. One of the images Isaiah uses to describe the messianic age is that of a lamb lying down with a wolf and having nothing to fear. It is a picture of a time of universal peace. The strong would no longer prey on the weak, or the cunning on the innocent. Yet, when we read the daily newspaper, at times we are ashamed to be human. Christ has come, yet little seems to have changed! What history: wars, wars and more wars. So many dead; so many tears; so many fears. The world is drenched in blood. As for wolf and lamb living together, often two neighbours or even two members of the same family, have a falling out and refuse to talk to one another.

The marvellous vision of the peaceable kingdom, in which all violence has been overcome and all people live in loving unity calls for its realisation in our daily lives.

Every time we forgive a neighbour, every time we make a child smile, every time we show compassion to a suffering person, and work for peace and justice among peoples and nations we are making the vision come true.

## **Saints of the Week**

Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> December - St Ambrose - Memorial.

St Ambrose was born in Trier, Germany, where his father was an official of the Roman Empire. He entered the same profession and became governor of Liguria-Emilia by 372. was tension between Arian, and orthodox parties among the Christians of Milan when they gathered to elect a new bishop in 374 and he counselled them to observe public order. He was an impressive speaker, and they acclaimed him as their bishop though he was a catechumen, and he had to be baptised and ordained in the space of a few days. He was strong and popular pastoral leader, opposing Arianism, and once excommunicating the emperor after an atrocity. St Ninian would likely have encountered him returning to Scotland from Rome in 394. He is a patron of the Scots College, Spain

# Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December – The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Solemnity

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is mystery of our Faith. It is one of several points where Our Lady was treated in a privileged way by God, emphasising her unique place in His Plan. As a doctrine of the Church, it was only promulgated in 1854, but had been a strong popular belief for centuries. Our own Blessed John Duns Scotus (1266-1308) was one of the greatest champions of this dogma.
