

Coltswood Cemetery Annual Remembrance Services

Please join us at this year's annual remembrance service in Coltswood Cemetery **on Sunday 26**th **November at 2pm.**

32nd **Sunday A.** The first reading exalts wisdom. Wisdom has nothing to do with being smart or intelligent or with the age. Growing older doesn't mean always growing wiser. To be wise means to know God's purpose for us and to live accordingly. We exhaust ourselves in the senseless pursuit of material things and die without realising the spiritual wealth. If we lose God, we lose all. If we find God, we find all.

Today's Gospel is about the importance of preparation. The wise virgins were well prepared to welcome the bridegroom with enough oils in their lamps; the foolish virgins were ill-prepared There are 3 kinds of Christians. Some Christians have their lamps shining very brightly and everyone can see that light. They are constantly aware that they are in the world but not of the world. They are very focussed in their love of God and neighbour and are willing to use all that they have for the promotion of God's kingdom in the world.

Secondly, there are Christians whose lights are dim. The light is burning but it is so weak that it is difficult to tell whether it is extinguished or still burning. This set of Christians are baptised but they do not practice their faith actively and so their lives are dominated so much by material things. They come to God only when they are in trouble. Such people sometimes, wait for the eleventh hour before they begin making preparations for heaven. However, not all of them are lucky enough to reach the 11th hour, as some would breathe their last at the 10th hour.

Finally, there are people whose lamps have no oil and whose light is completely extinguished. These are people who were once Christians but presently they do not believe in anything outside the material world and to make matters worse, some of them have turned out to be anti-Christians – challenging the message of Jesus and supporting anti- Christian values. For them, the parable of being ready and prepared for life after death makes no sense and the challenge of keeping their lamps burning is meaningless.

So, stay awake; and to keep your lamp burning, you must continue to put the oil of love in it.

Children who have been presented to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation are advised the attend one of the following weekend masses
