ADVENT: STAY AWAKE:

Three times in today's Gospel Jesus urges us to stay awake. The call to 'Stay awake' is a very appropriate call for the beginning of the new liturgical year. Habit plays a big part in our lives. All of us, except the very young, are to a great degree creatures of habit. It is said that we live the second half of our lives according to the habits acquired during the first half.

Advent gives us a jolt. It issues a wake-up call to us. It provides us with a chance to start again. We can easily become Christians of habit only. We may be just going through the motions, taking part in rituals that have lost all freshness and meaning. We don't hear the Gospel anymore. It goes in one ear and out the other. The face of Christ has vanished from our sight.

So, what is the solution? We need to be disturbed from time to time. This is where advent comes in. Advent calls us to wake up. To shake off the dust of routine and habit, and to let Christ come alive in our lives once more. The Lord is coming. He will come to each of us at death and to the world at the end of time. We don't know the day or the hour of his coming. Anytime is the wrong time for the unfaithful servant. But any time is right time for the faithful servant. The faithful servant doesn't fear the Lord's coming; he welcomes it. We have to be ready. How? By being alive, alert, responsible servants of the Lord and of one another.
