How to use the Novena Programme

Time

Decide for yourself how much time you wish to spend on the Novena each day, and commit this time to God, then before you begin your prayer, set a timer for your session.

(A suggestion for a daily prayer session would be 15-45 minutes.)

Lectio Divina

This may be your first experience of praying Lectio Divina. If this is the case for you, read over the instruction notes prior to your prayer session, in order to familiarise yourself with its four steps.

Resources

On each of the nine days, there is the Gospel text, a related image and a link to a hymn/song/video. There is also a link to the hymn 'Spirit of the Living God' (repeated daily). After reading the scripture, feel free to use or not to use the other resources, as you feel drawn. The word '[here](#)' (in blue) takes you to the hymn in Youtube, and clicking on the top arrow takes you back into the Novena resource (mail).

Journalling

Some time after your prayer session, you may wish to jot down a few notes about your prayer. This is called 'journalling' and a later reading of your prayer notes can sometimes reveal aspects/strands running through your prayer that you might otherwise miss.

Relax!

Although there are some instructions for the Novena, relaxing in God's Presence with Scripture is a lovely place to be. Enjoy this time of preparation for the wonderful Feast of Pentecost.

LECTIO DIVINA is an ancient Catholic prayer method for reading and praying with the Bible.

***Lectio* (Reading)**

In the first phase of *lectio divina* we read and understand what the passage says in itself. This is the literal meaning of the Scripture passage and the lessons everyone would recognise in reading it. This phase is summarized with the question:

What does the text say that everyone should understand?

We then read the text again, very slowly, allowing the Holy Spirit to draw us to a certain word (or very short phrase) that strikes us in some way.

***Meditatio* (Meditation)**

At this stage we ask, '*What does this word say to me, today, and to my life?*' We stay with the word, mull it over, savour it until it opens up to a fuller meaning for us. In this way we come to a deeper appreciation of how God is working in our lives through the sacred word.

***Oratio* (Prayer)**

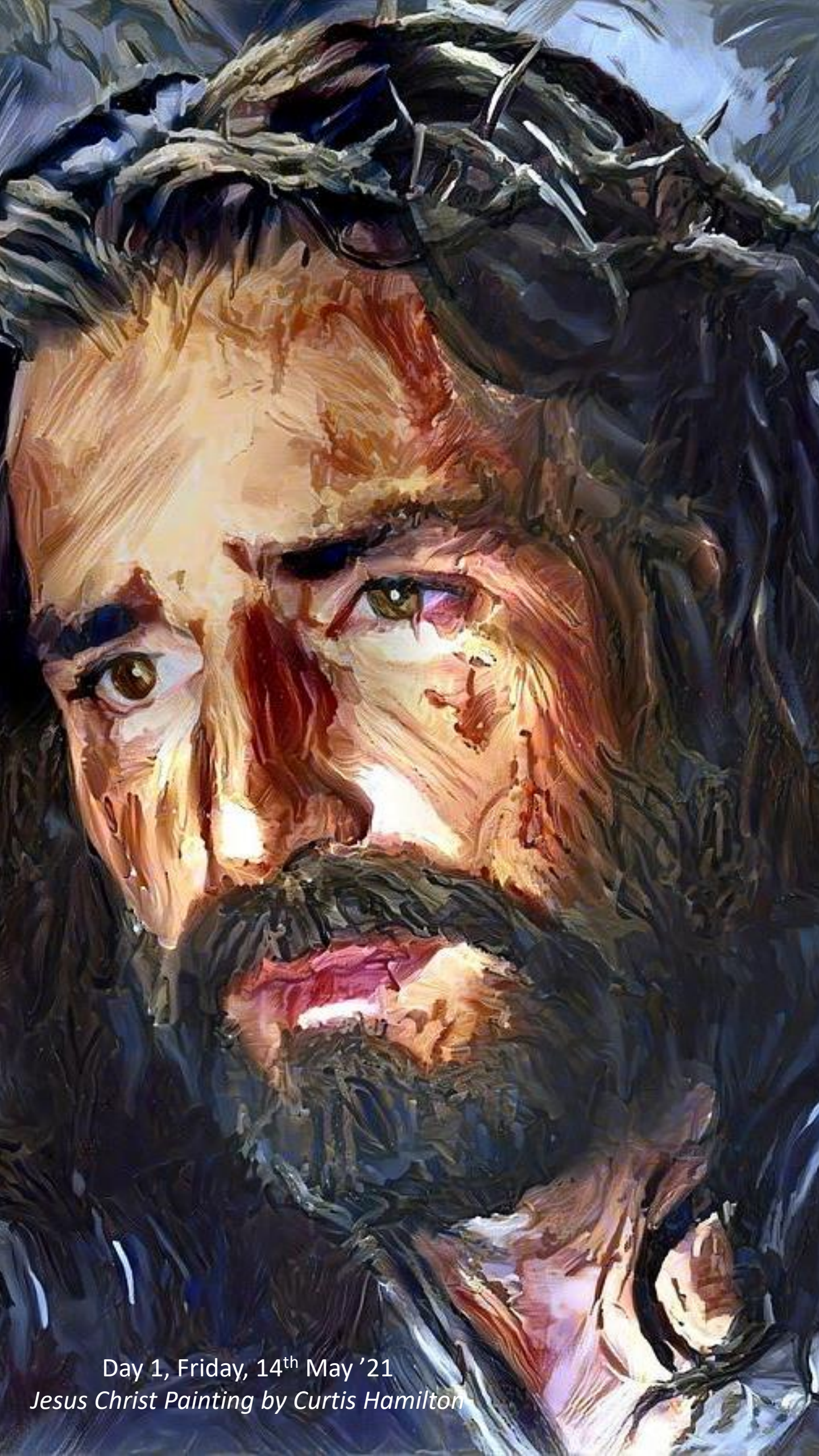
Through this meditation we experience an intimate encounter with God which leads us to respond in prayer. We consider prayer to be a simple conversation with God. We may ask petitions of him, we give him thanks, and we give him praise. At this phase we can ask ourselves: '*What can I say to the Lord in response to his word?*'

***Contemplatio* (Contemplation)**

This step comes with the willingness to change, an openness and trust in God, and the decision to follow God's will rather than our own. We ask, '*What conversion of the mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?*' We then spend the rest of our prayer time simply resting in God's Love.

Gospel – John 17:20-26

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said:

17:20 I pray not only for these, but for those also who through their words will believe in me.

17:21 May they all be one. Father, may they be one in us, as you are in me and I am in you, so that the world may believe it was you who sent me.

17:22 I have given them the glory you gave to me, that they may be one as we are one.

Gospel – John 21:15-19
