The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Today we celebrate the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. Mary was taken up into Heaven, both body and soul. The body of Mary could not know corruption: The body of Mary, which served to say "Yes!" to God on the day of the Incarnation of the Word, was and is forever a body of glory!

The book of Revelation describes the ultimate battle between God and evil, represented here by the dragon (the serpent of Genesis). The woman represents the Church, and the child represents Christ. Like the woman in the vision, the church was undergoing suffering and persecution. As the mother of the Saviour, Mary was at the heart of the battle between God and the powers of evil, which the reading from Revelation talks about. Therefore, it is entirely fitting that (through her assumption) she should share in the spoils of victory. The reading from Revelation was meant to encourage the early Christians who were undergoing suffering and persecution. It was meant to assure them that God would finally triumph. It should also encourage us. God will take care of us too. He won't save us from encountering evil, but will help us to overcome it.

2nd **reading:** Jesus is the new Adam, who through his obedience, restored to us the gifts lost by the disobedience of the first Adam. Mary is the new Eve who through her obedience to God, undoes the harm done by the disobedience of the first Eve.

Gospel: At the annunciation Mary said" It is not what I want, but what God wants that matters. Let what God wants be done to me. She accepted the task God gave her. Even though she didn't understand all the implications of it, she trusted that God would give her the help she needed. Today many people seek fulfilment and happiness through "doing their own thing". They believe that happiness lies in having no commitments, no one to answer to. Mary is great example for us, because life imposes a lot of duties on us- duties to ourselves, to others, and to God. Those who accept duty as Mary did may not find happiness and fulfilment and happiness in the eyes of the world, but they certainly will find it in the eyes of God and deep down they will know it.
