First Reading: Prov 8:22-31

Second Reading: Rom 5:1-5

Gospel: Jn 16: 12-15

Trinity Sunday C.

The doctrine of the Trinity is one of those subjects which leave everybody confused but we use it simply to describe how amazing God is. The Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God, and yet there are not three Gods but one God." In this Trinity of Persons, the Son is begotten of the Father by an eternal generation, and the Holy Spirit proceeds by an eternal procession from the Father and the Son. Yet, the Persons are co-eternal and co-equal: all alike are uncreated and omnipotent. This is the revelation regarding God's nature which Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came upon earth to deliver to the world: that He and the Father are one. the Father has never been without the Son, nor the Son without the Spirit. First Jesus taught the Jews to recognize in Himself the Eternal Son of God. When His ministry was drawing to a close, He promised that the Father would send another Divine Person, the Holy Spirit, in His place. Finally, after His resurrection, He revealed the doctrine in explicit terms, bidding them "go and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28:18).

People can know the truths of the faith and yet not know God. It is very important to have a correct image of God. If we get this wrong, everything else will be out of focus. How can we pray properly, or how can we have a proper relationship with God, if we have a false or inadequate image of him? The Christian sees life as a response to God's love. To tell what God is like, all we have to do is look at Jesus. In the words of St Paul, 'He is the image of the invisible God.' What is Jesus like? Of all the images we have of Jesus, one of the loveliest is that of the Good Shepherd. It was Jesus himself who used it. Jesus is the Good Shepherd, who gave his life for his sheep. In Jesus we see the Father's love for us. And what of the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is the bond of love between the Father and the Son, and between them and us. The mystery of the trinity is not something to argue about or even study. It is more something to pray about and live.
