

SOME THOUGHTS ON ASH WEDNESDAY and LENT

On Ash Wednesday we began the Season of Lent, a time of conversion and spiritual renewal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence and Catholics over the age of 14 are obliged to keep these days in accordance with the Church's laws on Fasting and Abstinence. The faithful seek this marking with ashes as a sign of repentance for sin, and a desire to live the Gospel with stronger devotion and commitment, while acknowledging our mortality and the realisation that we will give an account of ourselves to God when life on this earth ends. We are exhorted to take up the traditional Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving, and to persevere in keeping them through the 40 days of Lent and to renew our sorrow for sin and resolve to confess our sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. Only then, after making their confession, should those who have absented themselves from attending Sunday Mass receive the Holy Eucharist. We need to practice our faith in the manner the Church asks of us all.
