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

4th Sunday of Lent B -

God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. God took the initiative in our salvation. He chose the approach of love, not of power. God is not an absolute monarch, but a Father who is not happy until all his wandering children have come home. His love is all-inclusive. Love directed not at one nation only, nor only for the good, but at all nations, to the children of light and to the children of darkness.

But the gospel also talks about judgement and condemnation. How can condemnation be reconciled with love? God condemns no one. People condemn themselves by adopting a negative attitude. God sent us the light. If people get lost it is because they haven't accepted the light. The fault is not God's but ours. Those who prefer darkness to light have condemned themselves.

Evil people hate the light because it reveals themselves to themselves. They hate goodness because it reveals their badness, they hate industry because it reveals their laziness. They will destroy the light, the goodness, the love, in order to avoid the pain of self-discovery. It is terrible to reject the light, to reject God's offer of love. But how sweet to walk in the light of his love. Our part in the process of redemption is to accept God's gift in all humility, and try to collaborate for our own salvation. We are able to love God because God loved us first.

God and Church. Mass is a priority

Renew the contract of the school to have the children involved in various ways such as (A) Events created by the school in church (B) For the children to have roles within the grounds of the church ensuring they understand the physical /needs of the church as well as the religious aspect

Renew contract between the parents of children going to school such that a community of church/school. Parents come together to share ideas (barring exception of certain children's needs)

In this chapel it used to be the case the priest and a committee of the church would arrange events for the local people and their children in line with the religious calendar

What groups are disengaged

Children - 5-12/Teenagers/Adults 20-40

Schools/ Sick and housebound/ Those with lack of mobility/ Disabled/ Elderly/ Families/ Nero diverse groups

Parents of children with disabilities can feel unwelcome/uncomfortable/Embarrassed

How can we encourage more people to become active member of our parish?
