# **<u>Reflection: 5th Sunday of Easter B.</u>** <u>**Our need of a supportive community**</u>

There is much loneliness in the world. People today are crying out for recognition. They want to be noticed, not in a showy way, or because they have money or status, or just because they are human beings. The greatest need of all is the need to be loved. But often we pass one another by without the slightest sign of recognition. People can come to church and leave again without meeting anyone. Is that right?

The world is crying out for community. There should be no such thing as a solitary Christian. The fruit which Jesus desires from us is primarily that of unity among ourselves. The vine and its branches are one. There is a mutual interdependence of branch and vine, and branch with branch. To say, 'I will follow Jesus, but not the Church,' is to separate Jesus from the Church, to cut off the branches from the vine. The first disciples of Jesus had seen him, eaten with him, and spoken with him after his resurrection. As consequence they had a deep connectedness of with him, sense connectedness from which they drew great strength. Jesus made them his friends, and sent them out to bear fruit, the fruit of love. By this all will know that we are living branches of the Vine- by the bond and the care we show for one another.
