

Bishop Toal's Easter Message – 2024.

I wish everyone a very Happy Easter and pray for the blessing of the Risen Lord upon us all and our world. We pray especially that the peace offered by Christ as he appeared to his disciples at Easter may reign everywhere, especially among the peoples of his own land. May new hope spring up, even among the debris of war and the awful reality of human suffering and death.

The Wellspring Project, which I recently initiated in our Diocese, seeks to encourage a new vision and a desire for growth and participation in the life and mission of the Church here in Motherwell. Easter Reflection

We can't appreciate the greatness of Jesus' resurrection unless we acknowledge the full reality of his death. Jesus died in darkness. He trusted enough in God to face the darkness, and to wait for the resurrection. His faith was not vain. "God raised Jesus from the dead.

It is our death that has been defeated. As we go on in life, we become increasingly conscious of our mortality and the inevitable journey toward death. Death constitutes a huge challenge to our faith. The forces of darkness may seem overwhelming, irresistible, but the victory is already won. We must trust this victory. To be a Christian is to be a person of hope because of what happened on the third day. Christian hope is not a superficial optimism based on a refusal to look at the facts. Rather, it is a deep trust in God. Good Friday, Day of darkness and death, comes to everyone. So does Holy Saturday, that day of emptiness and sorrow. On such day it is hard to believe. But Easter Sunday, day of life and joy, will come as surely as the dawn. Death, the last enemy, has been overcome.
